Innovation in Teaching and Learning in Higher Education during the Corona Era

The Arab-German Young Academy of Sciences and Humanities (AGYA) in partnership with Palestine Polytechnic University (PPU) is organizing three training sessions under the heading 'Innovation in Teaching and Learning in Higher Education during the Corona Era' which will take place **ONLINE**.











Background and Goals

The recent outbreak of the novel coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19), which has caused major disruptions across all daily life activities, including academia, urged all of us to start exploring new ways and new tools to continue our academic activities especially those activities that are related to teaching and learning. The role of university instructors has moved far beyond preparing and giving lectures, and students are no longer dependent on the instructor to provide them with the information they need as they can easily find it by themselves. Most information can be gathered by students online rather than from handouts or even textbooks. The main goal of the lecturer now is to motivate students to strive for deep learning and to improve their transferable skills such as critical thinking and communication skills, in addition to offering them the opportunities to use digital tools to serve these goals. This role of educational meetings has appeared obviously in the days of university shut down due to the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic. Students find themselves in urgent need to depend on themselves and use their skills to be able to cope with the required academic activities. At the same time, university instructors found themselves in a situation where they could offer limited help to their students as they lack the necessary training.

The main goal of this workshop is to equip participants with the skills needed for them to be successful teachers online. This will involve three main themes necessary for each of them. They are (1) theories of teaching and learning in higher education, (2) methods of teaching and learning in higher education and using digital tools, and (3) assessment in higher education using digital tools. These three themes will be tackled through hands-on training by using digital platforms and tools such as Moodle, Google Classroom, and Socrative as a tool for formative assessment.
